Community Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner (CPCNP) Program

The CPCNP will provide expert palliative care to patients with complex needs. Patients will be supported to live comfortably at home at the end of their lives, and if wished, to die at home.

The CPCNP Program is part of the Ontario governments' 9000 Nurses commitment, a key component of Ontario's health human resources strategy.

Key Responsibilities of the Community Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner Program:

Home and Community Care Support Services Central East's Community Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner (CPCNP) Program is a dedicated team of Nurse Practitioners providing direct clinical care to patients with complex palliative needs, including pain & symptom management.

Inter-professional care is identified as the gold standard for Hospice Palliative Care (HPC). Working within a network of palliative care providers, the CPCNPs enhance continuity of clinical care across primary care, community supports, acute and specialty care sectors to support patients in living and dying in their place of choice.

The CPCNP's, who have an expanded scope of nursing practice, enhance the quality of palliative care by providing:

- earlier diagnosis of hospice palliative care needs
- direct clinical care in the home to the full scope of practice of the Nurse Practitioner
- pain and symptom management through prescribing and monitoring medication, and other interventions
- · support to patients in choice to die at home or in another place of choice
- · facilitation of direct admission to the hospital or hospice if it is the patient's choice
- a contribution to reduced hospital admissions and emergency department visits
- facilitation of increased access to hospice palliative care from primary care practitioners
- improved referrals to specialist care.

Important Facts (Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association)

- Only 10% of people die suddenly, while the remaining 90% will require assistance and support at some point in their lives.
- HPC is whole-person health care that aims to relieve suffering and improve the quality of living and dying.



- HPC may complement and enhance disease-modifying therapy or may become the total focus of care.
- HPC strives to help patients and their families prepare for and manage their choices for life closure and the dying process and to cope with loss and grief during the illness and bereavement.

To be Eligible:

To receive services, an individual must:

- Be aware of their palliative diagnosis;
- Be referred by a Home and Community Care Support Services Central East Palliative Care Coordinator;
- Be identified to have Hospice Palliative Care needs present or have the potential need for complex pain and symptom management;
- · Live within Home and Community Care Support Services Central East's boundaries; and
- Be supported by a Most Responsible Physician.

Hours of Service: Monday to Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

On-call support available after hours and on weekends and statutory holidays.
